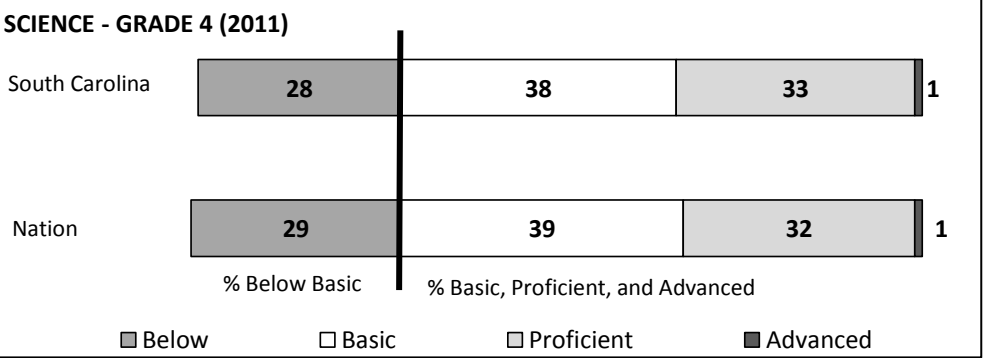
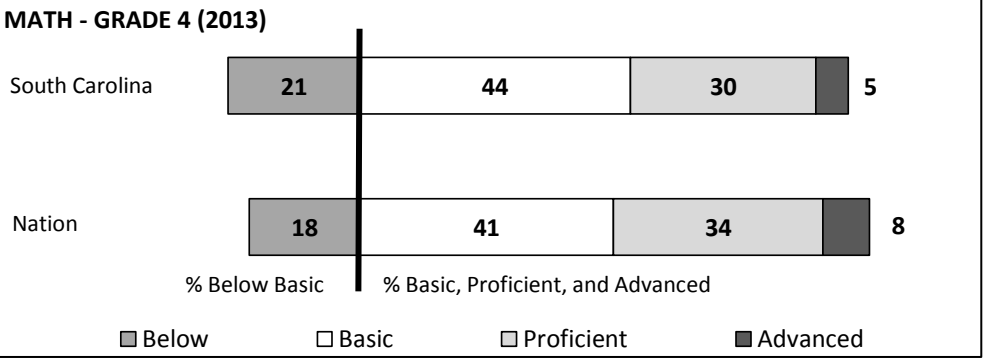
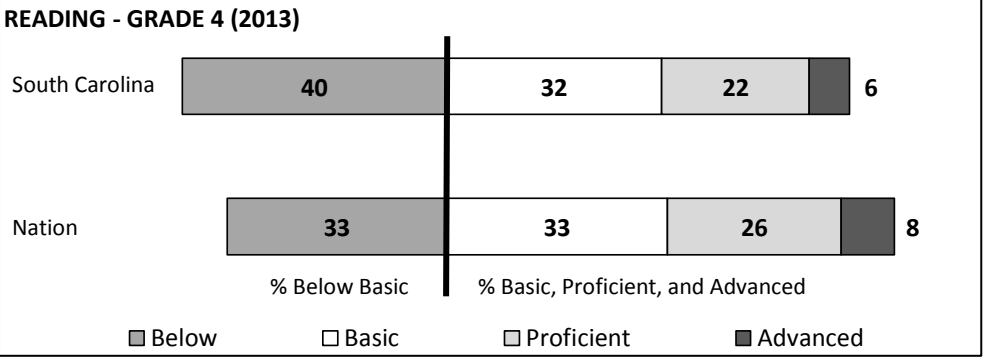
SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Arden Elementary School continues to strive towards academic excellence in all facets of the educational arena to include academics and character education. Our goal is for students to not only excel academically, but to become model and productive citizens. In an effort to achieve our goal, we have continued to diligently provide a developmentally appropriate curriculum in a safe and supportive environment. Teachers utilize Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) data, District common assessments, SuccessMaker reports, classroom formative data, and Dominie data to meet the individual learning needs of all students. We have implemented instructional strategies that allow for rigorous assessments and differentiated instruction. Teachers provide small group instruction and re-teaching plans based on data analysis for objectives mastery. Response to Intervention (RTI) process provides support for students in grades K-5th through various avenues of support for students’ needs. The implementation of the Common Core State Standards was main focus of the 2013-2014 school year.

Several of our teachers/staff members are currently enrolled in programs of higher education or taking courses to enhance teaching and learning in their classrooms. A few teachers participated in a Nature- based Inquiry Science project based on a grant sponsored by the University of South Carolina. Teachers and students created gardens to enhance teachers’ inquiry-based science teaching practices.

We have high expectations, committed and dedicated teachers, and on-going collaboration to foster a continual focus on learning for all students. Programs such as Accelerated Reader, Reading A-Z, Starfall, Balance Literacy, Leveled Literacy Intervention, SuccessMaker, Interest Clubs, Mentoring, and educational field trips support academic and behavioral success provided by our staff.

Our parents and community play key roles to our positive school climate and are major contributors to the school/community relationships that Arden exhibits. Overall, our parents support their children’s success by ensuring their child is ready for learning each day, attending parent conferences, volunteering by assisting with homework, attending Family Learning Night activities, and working with the laptop program.

Our School Improvement Council continues to provide suggestions to engage more parents in an effort to ensure student success. The guidance counselor, principal and council members recognized approximately 55 parents and volunteers at our End-of-the year celebration.

Arden has received many accolades for sustaining academic success. The school has earned an A rating on the ESEA wavier. The school is currently a recipient of the Palmetto Silver Award for the high performance and exceptional improvement. The school continues to perceive Arden’s strength as its diversity which hinges on a more conscientious and flexible learning environment. Our students are supported by parents and community, i.e., United Way, Union United Methodist, and Columbia College volunteers who tutor and or serve as mentors.
