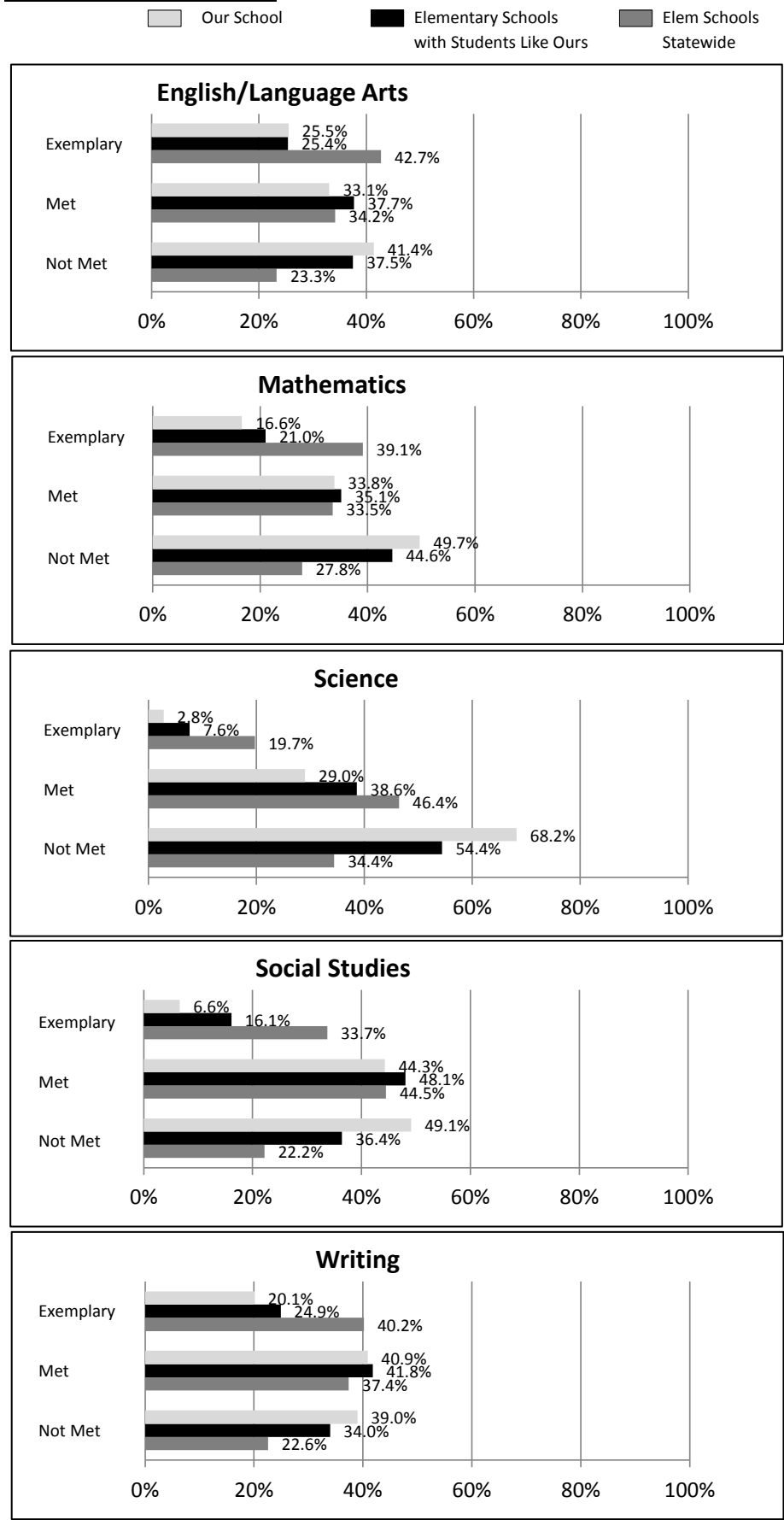

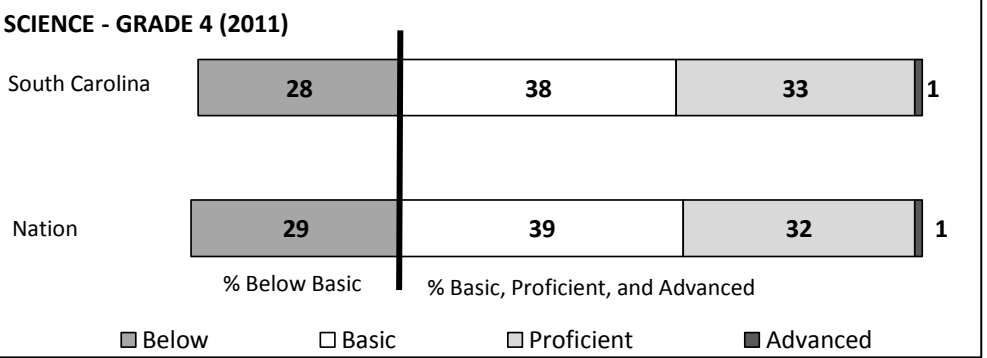

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

John P. Thomas Elementary takes pride in making growth from the previous school year. During the 2013-2014 year we have continued to focus on and implement the components of our District’s reading and math initiatives, building effective and sustainable relationships with parents, and community partnerships. At John P. Thomas, we provide a warm, welcoming atmosphere to prepare every student to be successful contributing citizens.

John P. Thomas has numerous programs to meet the needs of the “whole child.” The following programs or initiatives were implemented or continued this school year: reading teacher, interventionists for reading and math in grades 1-5, an additional Success Maker Lab Manager, Common Core ELA and Math Facilitators, Success Maker Laptop At Home Program, Leadership, Book, Dance, and Drama Clubs through Communities in School, Ladies and Gentleman Club, Accelerated Reading and Math, Comprehensive Remediation After-school Program, 21st Century After-school Program, Breakthrough to Literacy, and a structured Response to Intervention process for our students.

John P. Thomas Elementary School uses the Cycle of Continuous Improvement (PDCA) and data teams to monitor instructional delivery and student learning. We also recognize and reward students for academic and social improvements by giving the following student incentives: quarterly Nine Weeks Awards, monthly Tiger Character Awards, AR Awards, Student of the Month Awards, and incentive parties for Success Maker, MAP and PASS tests. Students are also involved in Fun Thursdays in the Comprehensive Remediation After-school Program for their hard work and dedication to the program.

To encourage parent participation and community involvement this year we offered: Fall Festival sponsored by the PTO, Parent Job Fair, Spring Fling, quarterly awards programs, Veteran’s Day Program, Muffins for Moms and Donuts for Dad, Literacy Night, Math Night, McTeacher’s Night, Parent Workshops, and Field Day.

We were actively involved with several community service agencies. We continued our partnerships with the VFW Post 4262, Palmetto GBA, Communities in Schools of the Midlands, Francis Burns United Methodist Church, the Burns Foundation, Second Calvary Baptist Church, Bethlehem Baptist Church and the Midlands Reading Consortium.

John P. Thomas Elementary School is very proud of the academic and social improvements that are demonstrated on a daily basis by our students, parents, faculty, and staff. We believe that together we can “Make It Happen” when we allow students to “Imagine the Possibilities!”
