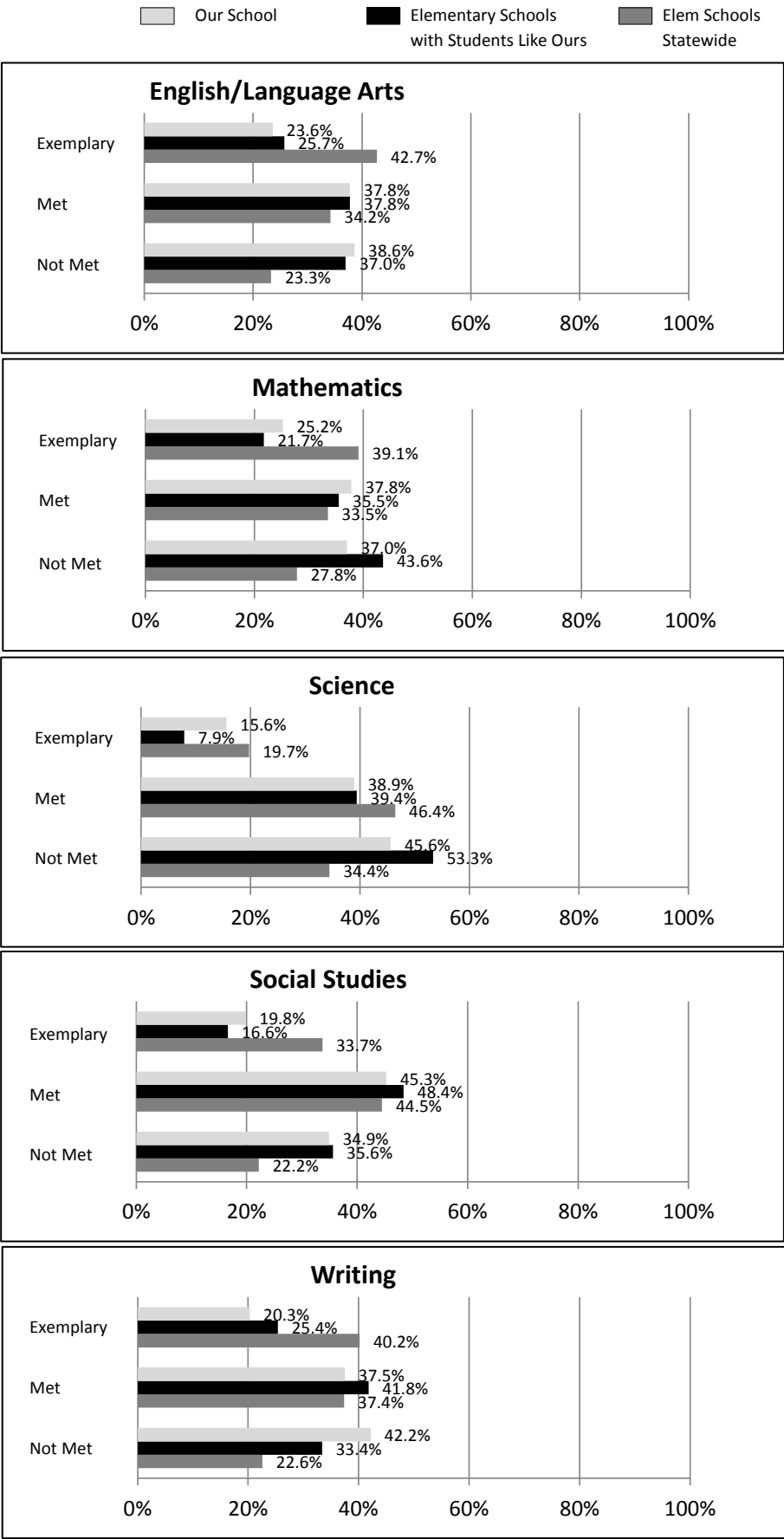

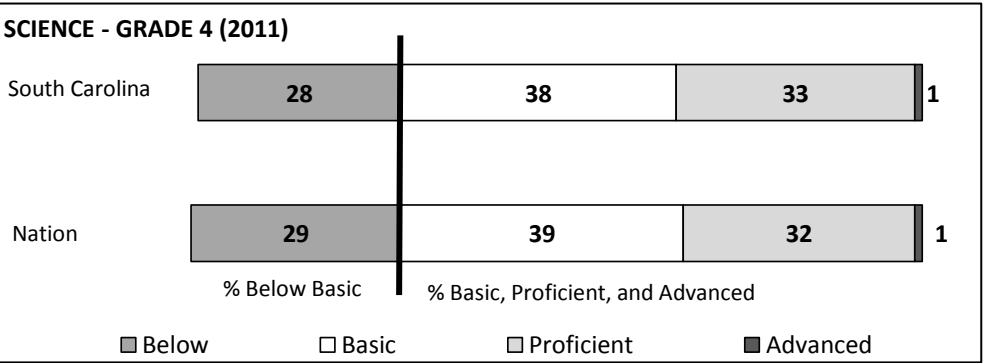

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

We believe that Webber Elementary is the finest school in Richland School District One because of our hard working teachers, students and supportive community.

For the second consecutive year, our students progressed academically by earning both a Gold and a Silver Palmetto Award. Our Silver Award was for the school’s progress in closing the Achievement Gap between groups of students. We were awarded the Gold Award for our general overall performance for the first time as a result of our report card rating of an “A” grade for the second year in a row as well as on our 2012-2013 School Report Card. Additionally, as a Title One school, Webber Elementary ranked in the top 5% of schools in South Carolina in student progress, and continued to rank in the top ten in our district for several years now.

Our school promoted the process learning of the Science Fair by involving the entire school in the projects this year. We also have an increasing number of students being selected for the MEGSSS program and again numerous students selected for the Duke TIP program of high achieving students. Not surprisingly, our students continue to live up to our high expectations for each of them.

The parents, PTA, SIC, our business partnerships with International Paper, SCE&G Wateree, the robust Webber Alumni Association and the Eastover community continues to be a source of support for the school. We are grateful for the various types of support they provide for our children.

At Webber Elementary School our students are taught that there is good in giving to others in need. Our United Way campaign earned our school recognition as the highest per-capita contributors of the elementary schools in Richland One with this being our 4th year of exceeding our goal and being the top contributors of all elementary schools. Children do learn by example as well.

As we continue to celebrate the achievements of our students, we encourage our parents, community and friends to visit us often and share our joy in seeing the smiling faces of young children being taught that they are indeed capable of success and are in the midst of realizing they are on their way to becoming the productive citizens that we see in each and every one of them. It remains our vision and mission.
