Report of Principal and School

At GHS, we have committed ourselves to our mission: to educate all students to become responsible, productive citizens and life-long learners. We have worked toward providing an environment to make each of you college and career ready. We believe that education is the joint responsibility of students, family, school, and community. We create a positive school environment by celebrating school successes. Students are recognized regularly for success in academics, athletics and the arts. We recognize achievement through the school web page, daily announcements, the local newspaper, awards programs, and positive behavior recognition days. Students are provided with an equitable balance between teamwork and individualism as shown by high accomplishments in academics, arts and athletics. Students are given ample opportunities to excel. Students are asked to participate in extracurricular activities which helps build relationships and improve student involvement in school. A strong and effective faculty and staff, along with parent/guardian support are essential for educational success. Teachers follow standards-based curricula in content areas. Students achieve success at appropriate instructional levels through high expectations. Faculty members recognize, respect, and address students' diverse learning styles through individual, small group, and whole group instruction. Students benefit from the consistent application of school policy. A safe and secure school environment encourages students to practice tolerance and to act responsibly. The faculty, staff and students of Greenwood High School have many accomplishments. Mrs. Kathy Johnson will serve as the GHS 2014-2015 Teacher of the Year while Mrs. Beth Doyle will serve as the Support Person of the Year. On June 6, 2014, 224 seniors graduated from GHS. As of May 31, 2014, the senior class recorded over 4.3 million in scholarships and other awards. During mid-year graduation, 80 GHS seniors received diplomas. Literacy Day was celebrated on October 30, 2014. Eagle Time Advisor/Advisee sessions were held bi-monthly to assist students with academic awareness, standardized tests, and college and career exploration. GHS continues to foster a "college going culture" by engaging our students in Career Academics, AVID, and PBIS. AVID students attended a Career Fair and Charlotte Bobcats game in the fall of 2103. The GEMS Club visited USC Upstate on November 13, 2013. On March 28, 2014 the GEMS Club visited the Martin Luther King Jr. Center, CNN and The World of Coke in Atlanta. College Application Day was held on October 11. Students attended a College Day on October 29. The GHS SGA visited Clemson University to attend a Leadership Conference on February 26, 2014. Athletics continue to thrive with girls basketball finishing the season as Region Champions and Upper-State Champions. The GHS Baseball Team also finished their regular season as Region Champs. GHS Arts continue to flourish with the GHS Advanced Chorus had 20 students selected by audition for the SC All-State Chorus; they also received a Superior Rating in Performance at State Choral Festival and Superior Rating in Sight Reading at State Choral Festival. The Golden Eagle Band had thirteen students qualify for All-County Band. JROTC received Honor Unit with Distinction. ☐

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. 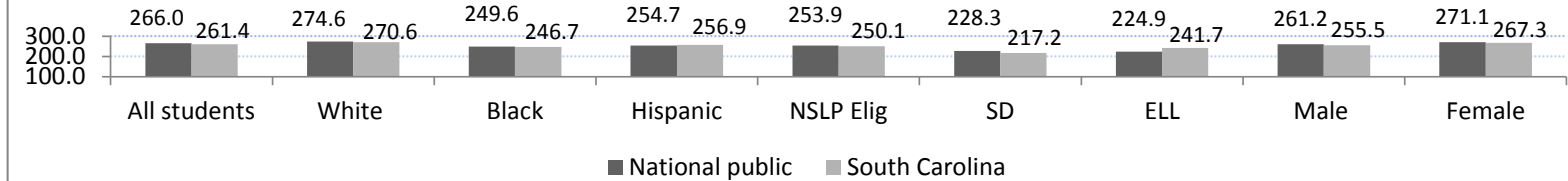

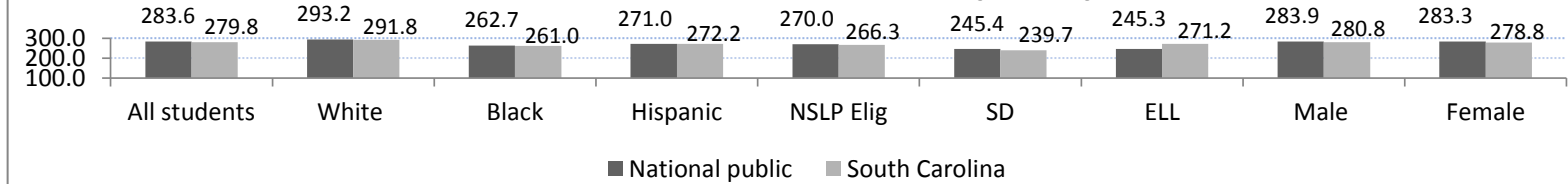
