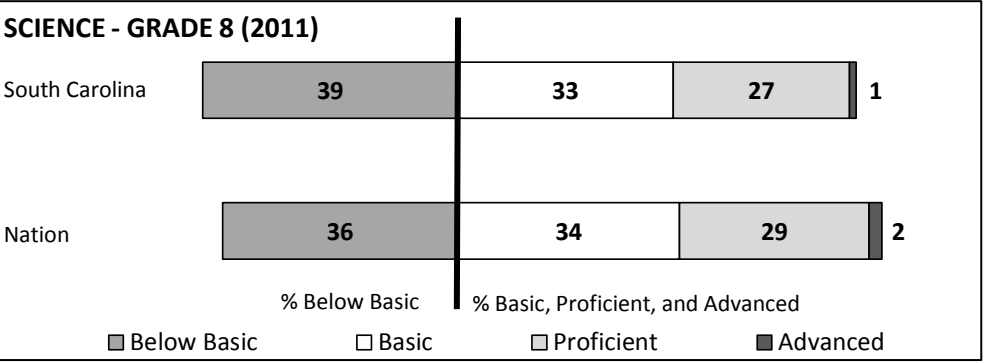
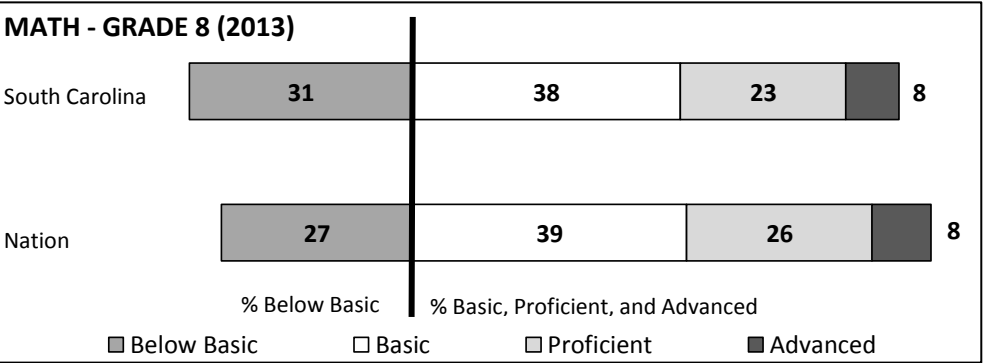
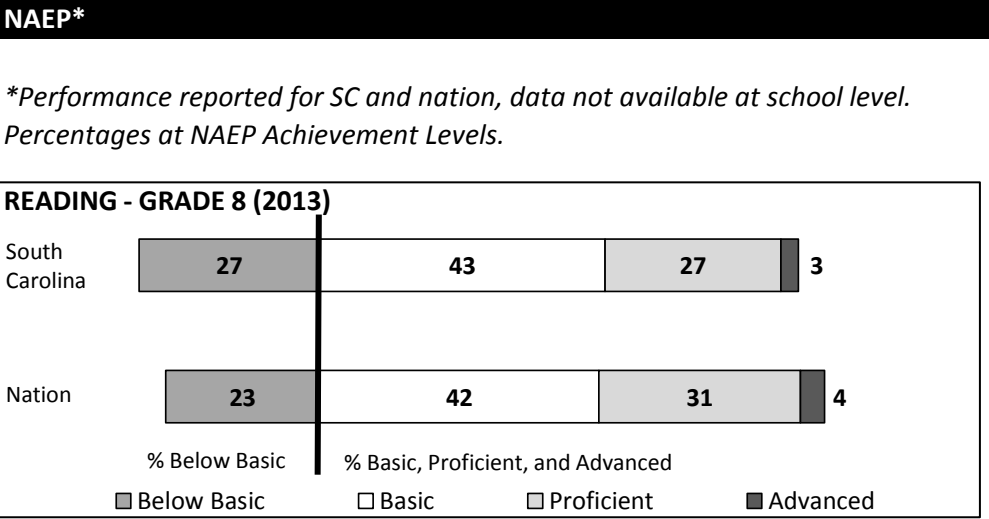

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL
IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Our 2013-2014 school year was a great one at West-Oak High School. The hard work of students and faculty has resulted in improvements in many areas as we continue our tradition of excellence. 195 seniors graduated in the class of 2014. They received over \$5,000.000 in scholarship offers - an outstanding accomplishment. In addition, we had four Palmetto Fellows, and 135 students qualified for the Life Scholarship—over 69% of our graduates. Our athletic, fine arts, and co-curricular programs continue to grow in size and accomplishments, and our faculty and staff remain committed to continuous improvement at WOHS.

Throughout the year we have examined and evaluated a host of data sources to seek continuous growth and improvement. Our Professional Learning Communities have focused on developing instructional strategies, grading practices, and working with students from a variety of socio-economic backgrounds. We are continuing to implement the strategies from the Metis Leadership group as we build and foster a healthy school climate. This three year staff development focused on improving student achievement by establishing positive relationships with students, improving instruction, establishing proven classroom management practices.

Academically our students have excelled as they work to pursue their post secondary goals. Over 337 students completed the year with a GPA of 3.5 or higher. Platinum seal awards were presented to over 76% of our seniors. College bound students were encouraged to participate in our SAT planning sessions sponsored by our guidance department.

Our students were recognized for outstanding performances as they competed with others across the region and state. Several band, orchestra, and choral students qualified for all-county, all-region, and all-state levels. In visual arts several students’ work was showcased locally and regionally. This year our drama department produced two performances - A Christmas Choral and The Chronicles of Narnia - to a packed auditorium. West-Oak athletics continue to have great success. Of our 16 teams, 5 participated in post-season competition. Our wrestling team finished second in the Upper-State and had three individual state champions. 20 student athletes were selected as region players, and 5 All State athletes, with one being selected as the AAA All State Girl’s Tennis player of the year. We are most proud that 32 seniors athletes qualified as SCHSL Scholar Athletes, having achieved a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher for their four years of high school.

West-Oak High School will improve and grow next year. We plan to continue working with our students, parents, and community to develop the educational opportunities at West-Oak in the years to come. Our goal is simple; we want to provide the absolute best education for our students. This year we adopted the senior motto “Vision to Reality”. This is our call for all our students as they rise to the challenge and opportunities of their future.
