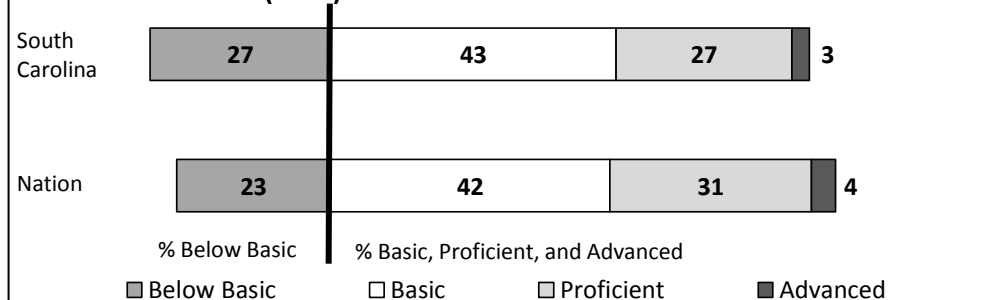

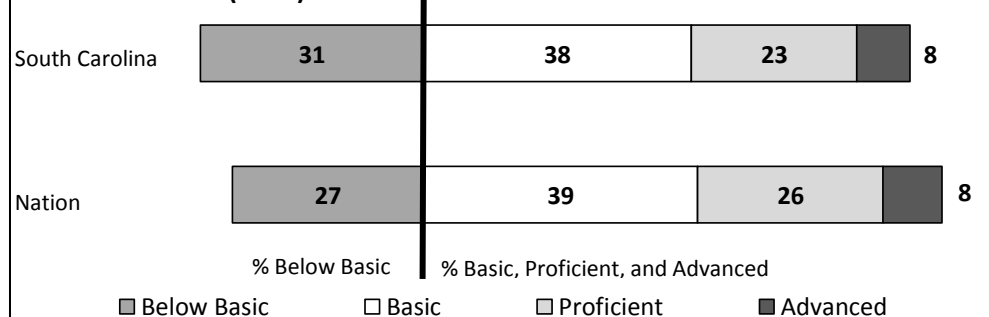

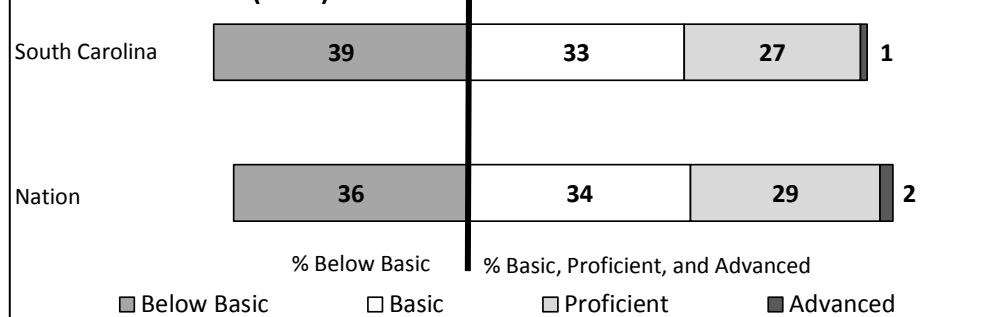
READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

ROMC strives to be an outstanding educational institution. Our overarching goal at Richland One Middle College is to increase academic achievement by connecting classroom activities to real world experiences. We achieve this by providing all students with rigorous and relevant instruction that includes varied learning experiences that are not limited to the classroom. We guarantee student success through understanding the importance of developing college and/or career ready students. By using Naviance, a comprehensive college and career readiness platform, and offering students varied opportunities to take part in career field studies, engage with community leaders, and participate in community service related activities, we are equipping students with the necessary tools to both identify and prepare for their post-secondary endeavors. ROMC continues to engage all students through the consistent use of technology and curriculum guided by the Common Core State Standards. Students are required to complete Senior Capstone and Junior Keystone Projects where they are tasked with selecting a research topic based on their career interests, writing about it, and generating a product from what they have learned. Evidence of ROMC’s academic success is in the 2013-2014 numbers. ROMC boasts of an 88% graduation rate, 90% passage rate in South Carolina Virtual School courses, 91% passage rate on dual credit courses, 89% college acceptance, and over \$1,000,000 in scholarship awards, inclusive of eighteen (18) Life Scholars and three (3) Hope Scholars.[?]
