F. E. DuBose Career Center operates as the delivery system for career and technology courses for Clarendon County. We serve students from all three public school districts, two private schools, Virtual School students, Faith-Based Schools, and one charter school. Students have the opportunity to participate in nine career and technology course offerings. They also have the opportunity to enroll in dual enrollment college credit courses offered through Central Carolina Technical College. High school students enroll in programs of study that are offered as two-year programs. Cosmetology students have the opportunity to complete their program in a three or two year program. Students enrolled in programs of study are offered the opportunity to gain college credit through an articulation agreement with Central Carolina Technical College and/or gain state and national certifications. They also have the opportunity to participate in work experience programs during the second year of attendance at F. E. DuBose Career Center. F. E. DuBose Career Center had 102 completers within our 9 programs with a total of 183 national or state certifications, college courses, or licenses. 100% of our Cosmetology students earned their SC State Board of Cosmetology License. Health Science had 79% of completers(100% of completers that attempted the CNA Exam Passed) gain their Certified Nursing Assistant Certificate and 88% passed the National Health Science Assessment. Law Enforcement Services had 100% of completers to earn 6 hours of college credit. 100% of Welding and Carpentry earned NCCER Certification. Four Welding completers gained college credit for Welding 110. Culinary Arts had 100% of completers become ServSafe Certified and 100% gain ProStart Certification. For the 2014-15 school year, all students completed a total of over 4,000 work-based hours within businesses and organizations in the community. Susan P. Anderson, Director

KNOWLEDGE

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. This table below shows the number of certificates at what level earned by **Career and Technology Education (CATE) completers at this Career Center**. Note that these data are self-reported by the Career Center.

In order to receive the National Career Readiness Certificate, a measure that indicates a student has the foundational workplace skills to succeed, a student must take three subtests in WorkKeys: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information.

Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments. A designation can only be earned after a student has taken the three subtests required for the National Career Readiness Certificate. The table to the right show the level score requirements for each certificate level.
