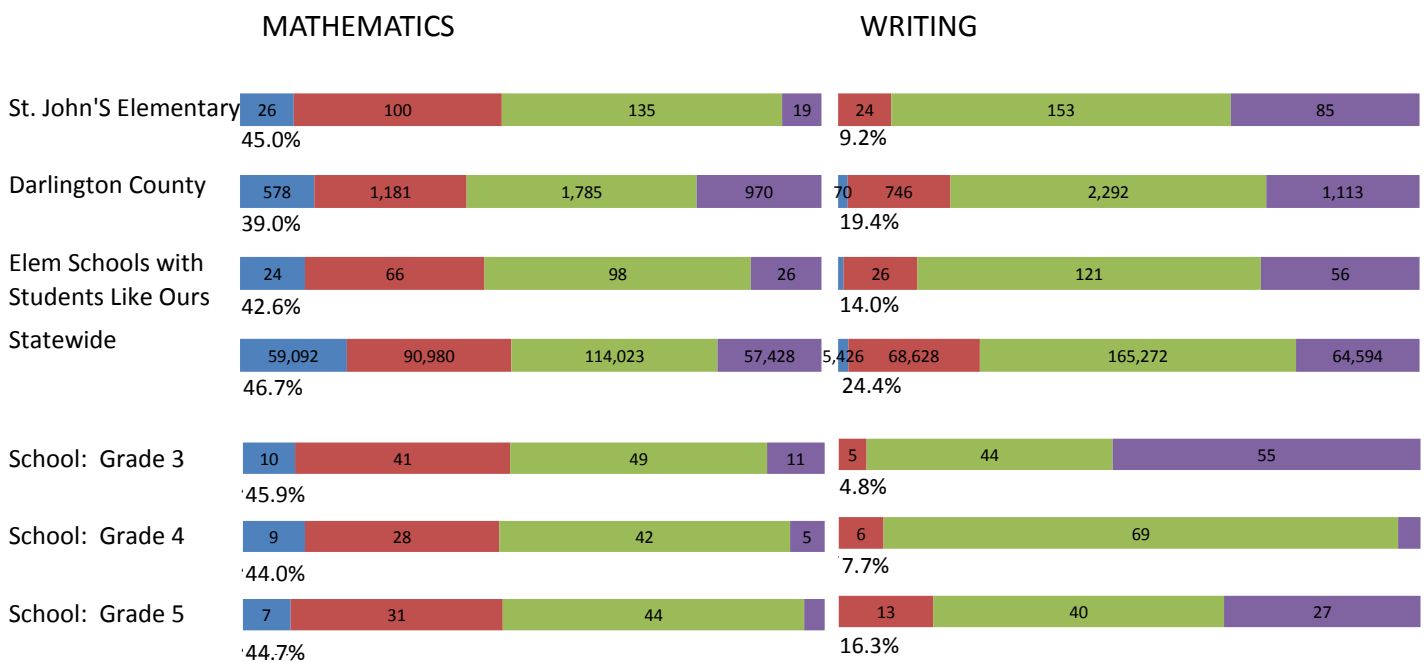
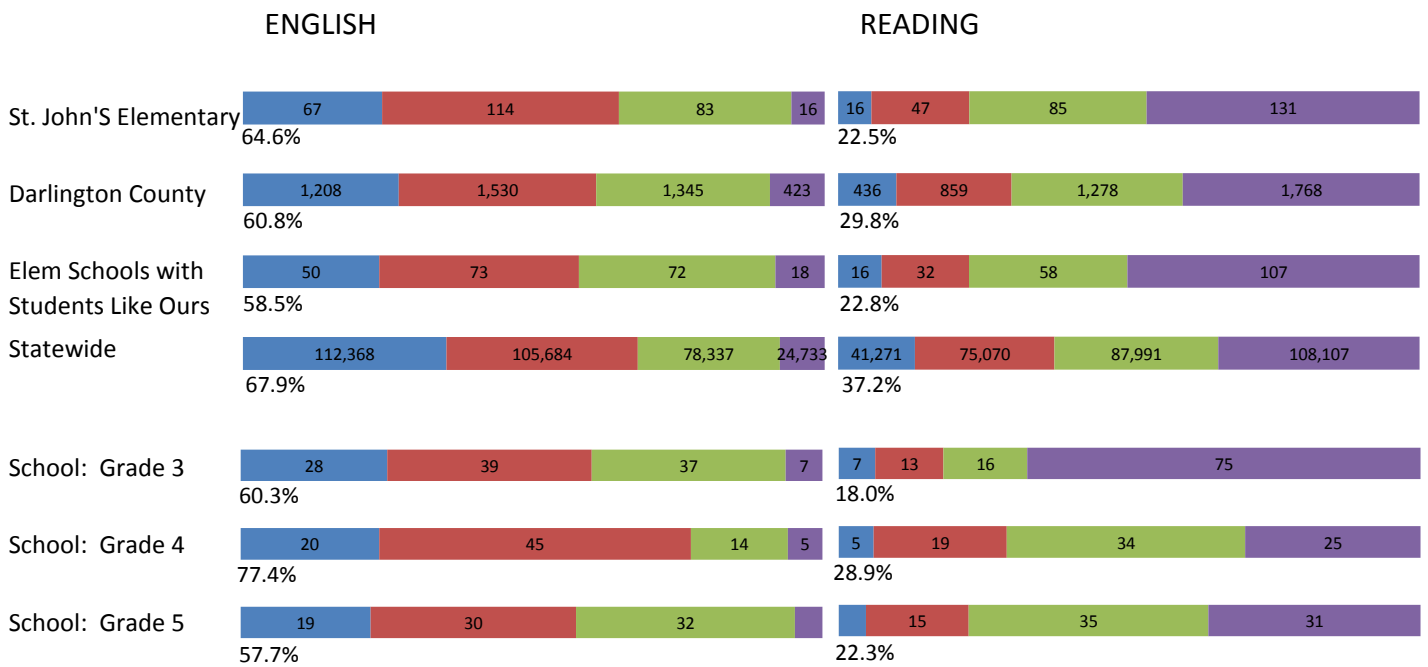
St. John's Elementary, a Title I school, had a productive 2014-2015 school year. The school worked collaboratively with parents and the community to promote excellence in academics, athletics, attendance, attitude and the arts. Balanced literacy instruction, First Grade Interventionist, Fast Forward, ALEKS, Kahn Academy, workstations, math RIT band groups, Accelerated Reader and Mobi Max Lab programs were provided to students. Fifty-six students were invited to attend the All A Banquet. One student earned all A's for five consecutive years! Honor Roll students were recognized quarterly. Identified students will be invited to attend DSAP. One fifth grade student earned one million points on Kahn Academy! Students read books throughout the year to earn induction into the Principal's Reading Honor Roll. One kindergarten student read over 2400 books. Students practiced math facts to earn induction into the Principal's Math Honor Roll. The student body supported the community by sponsoring the annual Christmas Canned Food Drive and participating in the St. Jude's Math-a-thon. Student Council Officers assisted during quarterly Spirit Day Assemblies, the Fall Festival and Awards Day. Student Marshals and the Flag Corps Teams provided students with leadership opportunities. The Annual Fall Festival, Spring Talent Show, May Day and Field Day celebrations provided opportunities for community involvement and participation.

District-led ELA, math, science and GT social studies sessions were held during the school year to strengthen teacher knowledge and instruction of the standards. The school-wide PBS Model continued to acknowledge appropriate student behavior. Morning math and reading tutorial services were provided to students. After school computer lab sessions were provided for identified third-fifth grade students. Computer labs provided daily thirty minute sessions for all first through fifth grade students. St. John's Elementary earned a Growth Rating of Average and an Absolute Rating of Average for the 2013-2014 school year. The Association of Parents and Teachers sponsored a variety of fundraising activities. The School Improvement Council and numerous business partners worked collaboratively to improve the school. St. John's Elementary continued its tradition of excellence, serving the Darlington Community since 1818.

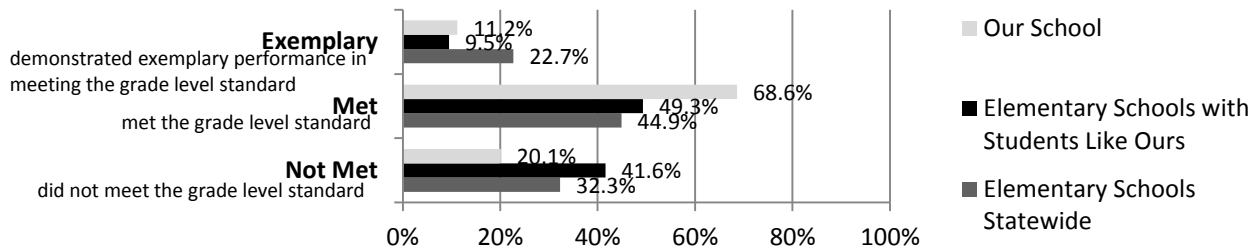

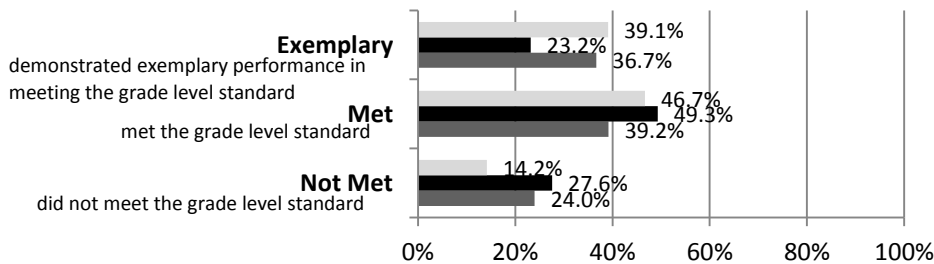
