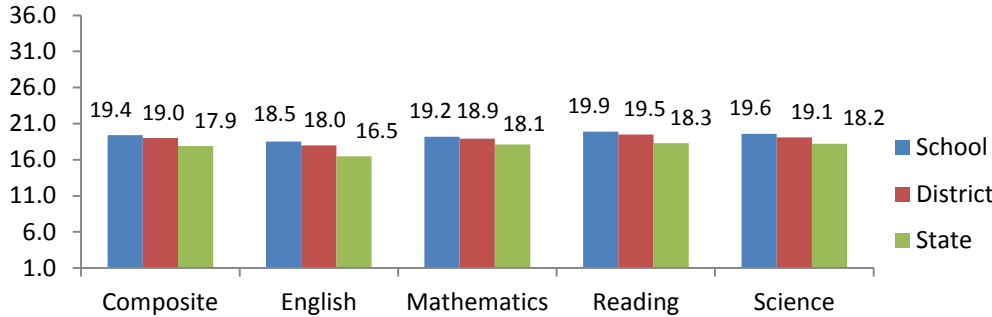

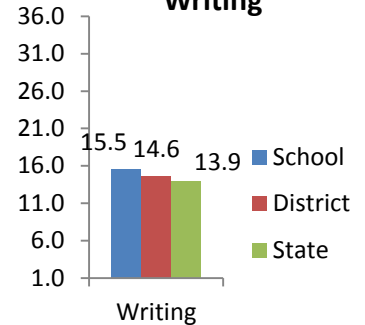
The 2014-15 school year marked the fourth year that Powdersville High School has been open, and on May 28, 2015, we graduated the first class to complete all four years at our school. We set lofty goals when we opened in 2011; one of which was to receive an excellent rating on our first report card, which we achieved at the end of the 2013-14 school year. Powdersville High School has established a standard of academic excellence with test scores which rank as the best not only in our district but also across the state. In addition, our band won its second State Championship in 4 years, opportunities in the arts continue to expand as our school grows, and our athletic teams have begun to compete for championships in our region. Perhaps the biggest challenge we faced this year was the implementation of the Anderson One Innovative Digital Innovation Initiative. All students at Powdersville High received an Apple iPad this school year. As the year developed, iPads became an important tool for our students and faculty. Efficient organization, instant access to information, and the ability to demonstrate learning in a variety of new methods were among the benefits of these new devices. Additionally, as we began to standardize how we deliver and store important information through Apps like My Homework and Notability, our communication with students and parents has become much more effective. **Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing**

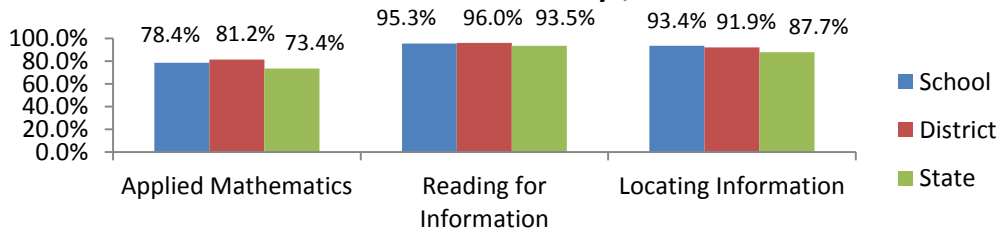


The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

ACT benchmarks are scores on the ACT subject-area tests that represent the level of achievement required for students to have a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher or about a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in corresponding credit-bearing first-year college courses.

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
