**CONSENT ORDER OF
SUSPENSION**

SUMMARY OF THE CASE

The South Carolina State Board of Education (State Board) considered this matter on November 8, 2016. On October 3, 2016, the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) sent notice to Mr. Corning informing him that the State Board would meet to make a determination regarding the possible suspension of his educator certificate by regular and certified mail, return receipt requested. Mr. Corning received the notice on October 12, 2016, as evidenced by the signed postal receipt. On October 17, 2016, Mr. Corning contacted the SCDE to discuss an alternative resolution of this matter. Mr. Corning has agreed to waive his right to a hearing and enter into a Consent Order of Suspension of his educator certificate 232638 for a one year period. After considering the evidence presented, the State Board voted to accept the Consent Order of Suspension of Mr. Corning's educator certificate for a period of one year commencing on November 8, 2016, and ending on November 7, 2017.

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FINDINGS OF FACT

Mr. Corning holds an educator certificate and has nine years of educator experience. He has no prior record of disciplinary action with the State Board. He began employment with the Charleston County School District (District) in 2007. Mr. Corning was employed as a teacher at Wando High School (School) when allegations arose concerning an inappropriate comment made during class in the presence of students. The District placed Mr. Corning on administrative leave during an investigation in the allegations. The District determined that Mr. Corning violated District Policy GBEB, Employee Conduct, as a result of his disrespectful comment during class as well as his

excessively familiar communications with students on social media. Mr. Corning subsequently resigned from the District, effective May 5, 2016.

On October 3, 2016, the SCDE sent notice to Mr. Corning informing him that the State Board would meet to make a determination regarding the possible suspension of his educator certificate by regular and certified mail, return receipt requested. Mr. Corning received the notice on October 12, 2016, as evidenced by the signed postal receipt. On October 17, 2016, Mr. Corning contacted the SCDE to discuss an alternative resolution of this matter. Mr. Corning has informed SCDE that he regrets his unprofessional behavior and his violation of District policy GBEB, Employee Conduct. He is currently not employed in the field of education. He has agreed to waive his right to a hearing and enter into this Consent Order of Suspension of his educator certificate 232638. After considering the evidence presented, the State Board voted to accept the Consent Order of Suspension of Mr. Corning's educator certificate for a period of one year commencing on November 8, 2016, and ending on November 7, 2017.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

"The South Carolina Board of Education may, for just cause, revoke or suspend the certificate of any person." S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-150 (2004); S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-160 (2004). Just cause includes unprofessional conduct. S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-160 (2004). The State Board finds that the evidence presented by the SCDE demonstrates that Mr. Corning engaged in unprofessional conduct as a result of his violation of District policy GBEB, Employee Conduct, by his disrespectful comment during class as well as his excessively familiar communications with students on social media. The State Board finds that the information presented supports its conclusion that just cause exists to accept the Consent Order of Suspension of the educator certificate of Edwin D. Corning, III, and to suspend Mr. Corning's educator certificate for a period of one year commencing on November 8, 2016, and ending on November 7, 2017.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered that the educator certificate of Edwin D. Corning, III, certificate 232638, is suspended for a period of one year commencing on November 8, 2016, and ending on November 7, 2017.

If Mr. Corning wishes to have his certificate reinstated at the conclusion of the period of suspension, he shall make a written request to the SCDE's Office of Educator

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Services. Mr. Corning shall be responsible for meeting all certification requirements in effect at the time he requests reinstatement and for the payment of any applicable reinstatement fees. The suspension of Mr. Corning's educator certificate shall be reported to the NASDTEC Clearinghouse and all South Carolina school districts within thirty days from the date of this order.
