**CONSENT ORDER OF SUSPENSION
(BREACH OF CONTRACT)**

SUMMARY OF THE CASE

The South Carolina State Board of Education (State Board) considered this matter on June 13, 2023. On October 6, 2022, the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) sent Nicole Denise Harrison a notice via regular and certified mail of her right to a hearing regarding the possible suspension of her South Carolina educator certificate based on her breach of contract. Ms. Harrison timely requested a hearing in the matter. Prior to the hearing, Ms. Harrison contacted the District to discuss an alternate resolution. Ms. Harrison has agreed to waive her right to a hearing and enter into this Consent Order of Suspension.

After considering the evidence presented, the State Board voted to suspend Ms. Harrison's educator certificate for a period of three months, commencing June 13, 2023, and ending September 12, 2023.

FINDINGS OF FACT

This case concerns a formal complaint from the Richland School District Two seeking the suspension of the educator certificate of Ms. Harrison for breach of contract. The State Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-150 (2020) and S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-530 (2020).

On May 10, 2022, Ms. Harrison signed a contractual agreement with Richland School District Two to serve as a teacher for the 2022-23 school year. Ms. Harrison submitted her resignation on May 19, 2022, effective June 3, 2022, citing a promotion/advancement within education. Ms. Harrison informed Richland School District Two and she gave two weeks' notice of resignation. Ms. Harrison also filled out the District's Separation Request Form. The Richland School District Two informed Ms.

Harrison that she would be released from her contract once a suitable replacement was found via letter on May 23, 2022. On September 27, 2022, the School Board of Trustees voted to report Ms. Harrison's breach of contract to the SCDE. On October 5, 2022, the District reported the matter to the SCDE.

After being notified of the pending action against her educator certificate, Ms. Harrison contacted the District to discuss an alternate resolution. Ms. Harrison has agreed to the suspension of her educator certificate for a period of three months, beginning June 13, 2023, and ending September 12, 2023.

After considering the evidence, the State Board finds that the evidence presented demonstrates that Ms. Harrison breached her contract with the District, and that just cause exists to suspend Ms. Harrison's certificate 233026 for a period of three months, commencing on June 13, 2023, and ending September 12, 2023.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

"The South Carolina Board of Education may, for just cause, either revoke or suspend the certificate of any person." Just cause includes, inter alia, "unprofessional conduct" and "willful violation of the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education." S.C. Code Ann. § 59-25-160 (3) and (4) (2020). Pursuant to 24 S.C. Code Regs. 43-58 (2) and (14) (2021), the State Board of Education has the legal authority to suspend a certificate for "failure to comply with the provision of a contract without the written consent of the local school board." With respect to breach of contract, "any teacher who fails to comply with the provisions of his [or her] contract without written consent of the school board shall be deemed guilty of unprofessional conduct." S. C. Code Ann. § 59-25-530 (2020). "Upon formal complaint of the school board, substantiated by conclusive evidence, the State Board shall suspend or revoke the teacher's certificate, for a period not to exceed one calendar year."

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The State Board finds that the evidence presented demonstrates that Ms. Harrison breached her contract without the consent and/or approval of the Richland School District Two. Accordingly, the evidence presented supports the State Board's determination that just cause exists to suspend the educator certificate of Nicole Denise Harrison for a period of three months, commencing on June 13, 2023, and ending on September 12, 2023. If Ms. Harrison wishes to have her educator certificate reinstated at the end of the suspension period, she shall make a written request to the SCDE's Office of Educator Services and shall meet all certification requirements in effect at the time she requests reinstatement. Ms. Harrison shall also pay the applicable reinstatement fee. The suspension of Ms. Harrison's educator certificate 233026 shall be reported to the NASDTEC Clearinghouse and all South Carolina school districts within thirty days from the date of this order, with the reason stated as "unprofessional conduct, breach of contract, willful neglect of duty, and failure to comply with the provisions of a contract without the written consent of the local school board."

AND IT IS SO ORDERED.
